On November 5, 2018 Bol Aweng, one of the Lost Boys of Sudan, spoke to over 300 fifth graders in the Licking Heights School District. The students will be reading *A Long Walk to Water*. They were surprised to find out that Bol had met Salva in a refugee camp in Kenya.
