PROFILE

Her job is to monitor mothers during pregnancy up to childbirth, to detect complication and refer mothers for addition care. She assists in delivering babies and does the post-natal checkups.

DURATION:

3 years (2017-2019)

HISTORY:

Amuor has been a valuable staff member as she has delivered many babies and several sets of twins. There used to be 1 in 50 mothers who died in childbirth. Now mothers with even complicated issues are able to safely and successfully deliver healthy babies.

Checking up on twins born in 2017 and this year

We heard that there was another set of twins born at the clinic this month. We asked David, the clinic lab tech, how the first twins who were born at the clinic were doing. He wrote back to share that they were doing well and sent a photo of them when they were 20 months old. The photo on the right is when they were just delivered. This

was Amuor's first delivery of twins which is always a difficult job. When Steve Walker, Jok and Bol visited the clinic in 2018 they were able to hold the healthy 6-month-old twins. (Photo on the lower left)



Here are the twins when they are 20 months old. Their mother is 30 years old. A woman who has delivered twins is always faced with challenges of providing enough breast milk, food and clothing.

Here is another set of twins born at the clinic. They are 4 and half months old. David said the mother does not have enough breast milk to support her God given twins.
